Principal's Message

Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

This Friday numerous children from OLOL will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation at our OLOL Parish Church.

Receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, a person's relationship with God is made stronger. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit are strengthened: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. In this way the person receiving the sacrament of Confirmation is equipped to become a better witness to Christ in the world.

During the celebration of Confirmation the bishop, or the bishop's delegate, extends his hands over those to be confirmed and calls upon God: "Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and quide."

Then each person to be confirmed is anointed with chrism on the forehead as the celebrant says, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit."

In Confirmation the person becomes more closely united with Christ. With the strengthening of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit the person receiving the sacrament is able to accept new responsibilities for witnessing Jesus to the world.

We pray for our young people as they continue to grow in faith.

RE NEWS

On many occasions throughout the year we come together and pray in a eucharistic celebration. We often do this for Feast Days, Sacraments and special occasions and events such as Mother's Day and Father's Day. This is a time when we pray together as a school community and/or as a parish. At Our Lady of Lourdes we are very blessed with having a wonderful parish priest, Father Henry, who encourages our participation in the Mass.

On Sunday May 26th our school will be leading the Parish Mass at 9.30am. This is a wonderful opportunity for the students of our school to show the extended community how we celebrate our liturgies and Masses at OLOL. Some children will be leading the Gospel Procession, the choir, a Reflective Movement after Communion, the readings and the Offertory. Children's Masses are often very different to regular Sunday Masses and we are confident that the students of OLOL will bring an upbeat, whilst reverent, aspect to the Mass as we normally do through our school celebrations.

Please consider attending this Mass as your regular Sunday timeslot this weekend and support those students as they lead our wider community. As normal, there will be morning tea provided after the Mass and this week it is a responsibility of our school. Could you kindly send in a packet of biscuits, a slice, or some cupcakes that might be suitable to serve after the Mass has finished? These food items can be left in the kitchen in the hall on Sunday morning but if you are unable to attend on the day, your contribution will be appreciated and accepted at school on Friday. We will also need some volunteers to help set up and serve the morning tea. If you are able to help with this could you please let the school office know? Your support will be much appreciated.

Receiving The Eucharist at Mass. (Holy Communion)



The word 'communion' means to be united with; Catholics believe that in Holy Communion we are united in a special way with Jesus Christ.

At his last supper, Jesus said of the bread that he shared among his followers, "Take and eat, this is my body." When we receive Holy Communion, Catholics believe that in a mysterious way we are sharing in the body and blood of Christ.

At each eucharistic celebration, those who have made their First Holy Communion are invited to receive the Eucharist again. This is a very special sacrament that requires the person to prepare themselves spiritually for the occasion. It is a holy and reverent ritual that makes the celebration purposeful. Only those who have made their First Holy Communion are able to receive Communion again. If you have not made the sacrament then you are encouraged to come to the priest to receive a blessing rather than receiving the Eucharist (host). At each of our school Masses, the community is invited to either receive Communion in the form of the host or otherwise you can receive a blessing from Father Henry. If you would like to receive a blessing you can join the line that leads to Father henry and then as you approach him, you need to cross your arms in front of your chest. This indicates to him that you are not able to receive Communion, but you would still like a special blessing from him. This ritual is encouraged at OLOL.

The Big Dig Archaeology Education Centre is part of Sydney Harbour YHA in The Rocks heritage precinct of Sydney. The centre facilitates hands-on archaeology educational experiences and opens the archaeological site to the public.

Stage 2 students from OLOL went to The Big Dig earlier this week and worked as archaeologists to excavate artefacts from the simulated archaeological dig, then used their investigative skills to discover what life was really like for the convicts and early settlers who lived in The Rocks during the 1800s. 
