Respect Responsibility Readiness to Learn Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

I wish to inform you of construction works that it is anticipated will take place during this school holidays, beginning on the 22nd of September, to rectify the surface of the Church car park at Our Lady of Lourdes, Seven Hills. The opportunity to renew the surface came about very recently as a result of negotiations between Fr Henry, the Parish and the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta.

The essential elements of the scope of works include removing the existing deteriorating surface, works to the exposed sub grade, supply and lay new asphalt surface and complete line marking. It is anticipated that all works will be completed during the holidays to minimize impact on the school. However, as with all construction works some contingency plans need to be in place.

If, for unforeseen reasons such as weather conditions, the work is not complete for the beginning of Term 4 the following alterations will be in place in terms of children being dropped off and picked up from school.

- A temporary Kiss and drop zone will be in place using the car park immediately in front of the school entrance. This will be in place in the morning and afternoon.
- Refer to the map included at the end of the newletter for the traffic flow for the temporary kiss and drop zone. Note that there will be **no right turn from school car park into Grantham Road.**
- In the mornings the Kiss and Drop zone will operate in the same way as it does at present just in the new location.
- In the afternoon rather than gather outside Year 2 students will be taken to the grass area in front of the school. Parents may either park offsite and walk in and collect their child/children *OR* choose to pick up their children by car from the Kiss and Drop Zone. If making this choice parents will be asked to display a sign with their family name in the front windscreen of the car so that staff can identify the car and organise for children to be ready to enter the car and ensure a smooth departure process. All families will be sent home a sign with the family name on it this week to facilitate this process.
- PLEASE NOTE THAT CARS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO QUEUE IN THE KISS AND DROP ZONE IN THE
 AFTERNOON AS THIS WILL IMPACT ON TRAFFIC FLOW. IF YOU ARE INTENDING TO PICK UP FROM THE KISS
 AND DROP ZONE YOU SHOULD NOT ENTER THE CARPARK PRIOR TO 2:55 TO ENSURE THAT CHILDREN ARE
 READY FOR COLLECTION
- There is to be no car parked at anytime in the kiss and drop zone.
- No parent parking will be available on the OLOL site.
- If you wish to park and walk your child to and from school parents are to park in nearby streets.
- We encourage you to use the Olive Street entrance as well to ease congestion. The Olive Street Gate will be open at 2:30 each day to assist with this.
- Pedestrian access will be via existing footpaths and is marked in green on the included map.
- Fencing will prevent access to the construction site for safety purposes.

The school will communicate towards the end of the school holidays the progress of the works and whether these contingency plans will need to be implemented. This communication will be via the skoolbag app, the school website and the electronic sign at the front of the school. We ask for the patience and cooperation of all families should these contingency plans be needed to allow for an important upgrade of the Parish and School site.

Life is full of good things. At OLOL we have much to be grateful for and as Term 3 draws to a close I reflect on the many blessings God has shared with us as a community. I thank God and am grateful for the goodness in my life and for the opportunity to work as a team with staff, parents and children as we work to show goodness to each other every day.

Pastoral letter on the same-sex marriage postal survey

Dear sisters and brothers,

As I write to you, the national debate on same-sex civil marriage is in full swing. It is an issue that many feel passionate about and hence, it has potential to polarise the community. I appeal to all Catholics in the Diocese of Parramatta to conduct this dialogue with a deep sense of respect for all concerned, and for the opinion and decision that each person is free to make.

It is important to remember from the very outset that the postal survey is about whether or not Australians want the legal definition of civil marriage changed to include same-sex couples. It is not a referendum on sacramental marriage as understood by the Catholic Church.

Many years ago, divorce was legalised in Australia; but this change did not alter the law of the Church. Therefore, whatever the outcome of the survey or the eventual legislation by the government, the Church will continue to hold that marriage is a natural institution established by God to be a permanent union between one man and one woman, directed both to mutual companionship and to the formation of a family in which children are born and nurtured.

For many Catholics, the issue of same-sex marriage is not simply theoretical but deeply personal. These may be same-sex attracted people themselves or that may be the case with their relatives and friends. In such cases, they are torn between their love for the Church and their love for their same-sex attracted child, grandchild, sibling, cousin, friend or neighbour.

As your bishop, I wish to reiterate the commitment I made at my installation: "I am committed to make the church in Parramatta the house for all peoples, a church where there is less an experience of exclusion but more an encounter of radical love, inclusiveness and solidarity." As a community of disciples, we seek to accommodate, accompany and care for one another irrespective of sexual orientation, marital status and situation.

I invite all Catholics in our Diocese to exercise our responsibility as citizens to engage in this community discernment. It should not be a matter of a simple answer Yes or No to the postal survey. It should be an opportunity for us to witness to our deep commitment to the ideal of Christian marriage. But it should also be an opportunity for us to listen to what the Spirit is saying through the signs of the times.


Throughout much of history, our gay and lesbian (or LGBTI) brothers and sisters have often not been treated with respect, sensitivity and compassion. Regrettably, the Church has not always been a place where they have felt welcomed, accepted and loved. Thus, regardless of the outcome of the survey, we must commit ourselves to the task of reaching out to our LGBTI brothers and sisters, affirming their dignity and accompanying them on our common journey towards the fullness of life and love in God.

Let us pray, discern and act with the wisdom of the Holy Spirit. Catholics, in keeping with the tradition of the Church, are asked to exercise their consciences, ensuring that they are informed as they come to exercise their democratic rights in the coming postal survey.

Technology in Stage 3

This term we have had some exciting new developments in our technology in Stage 3. We have purchased new iPads and Chromebook computers. Our Chromebooks are a smaller touchscreen laptop that can be folded and used as a tablet as well. They are a device for using many google features. One application in particular we are learning to use is Google Classroom.



We have been lucky enough to have the help and support of Mr. Chris Maguire from CEO, a specialist teacher in Digital Technologies, to come visit our school over the term and work with the Stage 3 students and teachers to learn how to effectively implement Google Classroom into our learning activities. Google Classroom is a blended learning platform developed by Google for schools that aims to

simplify creating, distributing and grading assignments in a paperless way.

Teachers have created Google classroom pages for English Menu Board tasks, Homework, Maths Tasks, PBL Projects, the Year 6 Market Day Stall planning and even in Creative Arts lessons. It's a great way for students to see their learning content, ask their teacher a question and submit their work online and receive feedback from their teacher. Students are also able to look at their schoolwork and complete and submit from home as well. It's a great tool for Stage 3 to help transition them to high school learning.





Students are also learning skills of screen casting and navigating through various Google platforms.
