#### **KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS**

Current families with siblings starting school next year should contact the school office immediately for an enrolment pack if they have not already done so.

#### Uniform

My thanks to parents for ensuring your child has returned to school in full school uniform. Please ensure that high standards are reinforced so that the children are proud of themselves and their school.

As an added aspect of teaching the children to respect themselves and the school, we have the expectation that all children will look after their belongings such as jackets and hats, ensuring they are returned to their own bags. Any property found that is labeled will be returned to the owner. Lost hats, jackets and lunch boxes will no longer be gathered outside of Year six as this has proven ineffective.

We ask parents to support in two ways. Firstly, set the standard with your child, no matter what age, that they are expected to bring home their uniform items and lunch boxes. Secondly, make sure all items are labelled clearly so that if they are left behind they can be returned easily. By doing this we can achieve two things. Your child will be taught to look after their belongings and it will save parents money!

#### **NEW FINANCE SYSTEM**

As from the beginning of this term the new finance system went live. There is a change in the way we process receipts. If you wish to receive a receipt when making a payment we ask that you ensure that the school has the correct email address. Receipts will be emailed to parents/caregivers nominated on the enrolment form. If there have been any changes please notify the office so that student records can be updated accordingly. Please also make sure your current Home/Mobile/Business numbers are up to date as well.

We ask for your patience and understanding during this time.

#### Attendance Update

School attendance plays a critical role in enhancing the lives of students in schools. Every day of attendance adds to a student's academic achievement and success at school. Parents are essential partners in promoting good attendance because they have the ultimate responsibility to ensure that their child attends school every day arriving punctually to begin lessons promptly at 8:45am.

OLOL for most of the year has had an attendance level of 90% or above. This is pleasing, however, at the end of Term 2 this dropped to 87.8%.

A small number of absences may be justified if your child has to:

- is required to attend to a serious and/or urgent family situation (e.g. a funeral)
- is too sick to go to school or has an infectious illness
- in the case of a natural disaster

Please help your child establish and consolidate a good attendance habit.

### RELIGIOUS LITERACY ASSESSMENT

The Bishops of NSW and ACT in 'Catholic Schools at a Crossroads' invite educational leaders and staff, clergy and religious, parents and parish communities, to dedicate themselves to ensuring that our schools are "truly Catholic in their identity and life" and "enable our students to achieve high levels of 'Catholic religious literacy' and practice."

With you, we are concerned to develop children's literacy in every area of learning, and this includes Religious Education. In one sense, a focus on 'religious literacy' is not new. Religious Education in Catholic schools has always aimed to develop children's capacity to express their growing understanding, appreciation, thoughts, questions and insights into God, Jesus, and the Scriptures, the Church, the Sacraments, Prayer and life as a Christian. This is essential to their participation in the religious life of the school and the parish.

Teachers are continually assessing students' learning and reporting to you on their developing religious literacy. In addition to this school-based assessment, and in consultation with the Parramatta Diocesan Schools Board. all Year 4 and Year 6 students in Primary and Year 8 and Year 10 students in Secondary will participate in a Diocesan Assessment of their religious literacy. Students in these grades will complete an online assessment during Term 3. The students will answer a series of multiple choice questions related to their learning in Religious Education. In addition, Year 4 students only will complete a variety of learning tasks related to the Religious Education unit, Reconciliation: God's Forgiveness and Healing. Their achievement in completing these tasks will be formally assessed. A report based on students' completion of these assessments will be forwarded to parents during Term 4.

#### **Out and About**

Welcome back to Term 3. I hope that all parents had



a relaxing break with their children enjoying the beautiful winter weather. This term once again looks to be a busy one with many exciting events to look forward to. Throughout this term we will be seeking support for our combined Parish/School Spring Fair that will be held early in Term 4. Parents are able to help in many ways and any support, whether big or small, is greatly appreciated. Keep watching the Spring Fair newsletters throughout the term. Throughout this term also the Woolworths Earn and Learn program will be running. This program allows the school to choose educational resources from Modern Teaching Aids based on the number of points earned from tokens. In previous years this promotion resulted in the school receiving many valuable resources. We earned 40,000 points previously and would like to aim for 50,000 this year. We are encouraging all families to collect the tokens being offered and to involve grandparents, family friends and relatives in the collection. Collected tokens may be sent to the school office on the prepared sheet. Wherever possible we ask that the sticker sheets are filled when they are sent to school. The promotion begins today and a collection box will be placed in the office foyer and the local Woolworths. We are seeking a parent to coordinate the program as our previous coordinator's children have now left the school. The role of the coordinator is to place a collection box at the local Woolworths supermarket, collect the sticker sheets from the school and supermarket collection boxes, ensure that the sheets are complete and count and record the number of completed sheets. At the end of the program the completed sheets are brought back to the school for processing. I will give the coordinator any support that is needed. As this role can be done from home there is not a requirement to have completed the Parents as Educators course. If you feel that you are able to assist with this role please contact me via the school office any assistance would be greatly appreciated and

be of direct benefit to our students.
