
Dear Parents

Today the school attended Ash Wednesday Mass to mark the beginning of Lent. We all, regardless of faith or age had placed on our foreheads a cross made of ashes. The ashes remind us that in Lent we try to become better people.

The banner on the altar read "Give, Pray, Fast". This is our guidepost for how we journey towards Easter during Lent. During Lent there are poor boxes called Project

Compassion in each class. Children are asked to think about what they eat today and on Good Friday and to avoid treats. We are asked to pray each day.

Here is the reflection from Stage 3 at Mass today:

Give up the darkness around us ... ignite the light of Christ

PARENTS AS EDUCATORS


A reminder that our first Parents as

The News in RE

Today (Ash Wednesday), marks the beginning of a

new liturgical season on the Church's calendar. Lent is a period of preparation for Easter that lasts for forty days. In this year of Mercy, Pope Francis has asked that we use this period of time in particular to reflect upon and experience God's merciful love through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As humans, we are constantly growing and changing. At times we need to stop to recognise our human condition and acknowledge the need to repent so that we can grow and change to be more like Jesus, and this is what Lent is for.

Children are keen at the beginning of Lent each year to share their understanding of the season by volunteering what they will be 'giving up' for the weeks leading up to Easter. Lent however, is not about saying 'no' to fun or our fasting from our favourite foods, but about saying a resounding 'YES!' to God. This year Pope Francis encourages us to fast from indifference towards others and God. While giving up small luxuries is a good start, making a conscious effort to become closer to God, to repent and have a change of heart thereby ultimately becoming better people through the transforming love of God, is much better.

Of course it is not an easy time. It does require commitment. The children are learning that the Church gives us the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist to help us through this transformation. We also participate in this process through the actions of almsgiving (giving to the poor), prayer (giving God time) and fasting (creating a space where God can come more fully into our lives).

The teaching and learning that is happening in the classrooms this Lent aims at developing in the children the knowledge that when we participate in the Sacraments combined with these three actions each Lent; we are responding to our deep love and longing for the Truth that is God.
