**Cross Country Note** 

Respect Responsibility Readiness to Learn Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

This weekend we will celebrate Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. The liturgy of Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem — only a few days before he was arrested and crucified.

In the story of Holy Week we witness the journey of Jesus to the cross. We see Jesus in all humility and obedience choosing to surrender himself for the good of all creation. In walking the path he did, Jesus abandoned himself completely into God's loving care and mercy. He shows us how to fall into the arms of God, trusting in God's absolute goodness.

The Liturgies of Holy Week are a public profession of belief in Jesus and His mission. They are in fact a splendid act of faith. Faith gives us an entirely new dimension to our lives just as it does to the rituals of Holy Week. Faith enriches our lives and the world in which we live. It is faith that enables us to allow God into our lives so that we can see ourselves, and our place in this world in a totally different and meaningful way.

Holy Week presents us each with the opportunity to reflect on God's plan for us. In today's world with so much suffering, injustice, anger, depression and loneliness we need to be people of faith "waving palms of hope, resurrection and new life" to point the way to a brighter future. Easter looks to the future, and Jesus invites us to look to the future with him.

Through the use of prayer and scripture the children and teachers will be reflecting on the significant events of Holy Week next week. I encourage you to take your children to the Parish celebrations during Holy Week that highlight the significance of these events for us as Catholics.

I also take this early opportunity to wish all our families a happy and blessed Easter in the coming weeks.

## **Out and About**

This year, as a school, we have been focusing on developing individual writing goals with our students. The aim of the process is for each child to have a very clear understanding of what they can do to improve their writing. These goals are targeted. They are **SMART** goals i.e **Specific**, **Measurable**, Achievable, Relevant, Time Bound. They are developed in consultation with the student but also with the data around the student's writing in mind. In writing these goals we are endeavouring to highlight for our students the next steps in the process of becoming more skilled writers. Our aim this year is that each child is able to articulate their personal writing goal. This will be recorded somewhere within the learning space. The goals will also be tracked to see what progress the students have made throughout the year. These goals will look different in each grade. Our Kindergarten students for example have goals such as "To write all my ideas in my story" whereas our Year 6 students have goals such as "To build on my ideas with rich vocabulary to help the audience understand my writing" each goal is relevant to the age and need of the student. Some students may have the same goal as they are working on similar strategies but within a class there will be a range of different goals. Ask your child about their writing goal - see if they can tell you what it is they are working on - as the year progresses and you visit the classroom look for evidence of the goals within the learning environment - ask your child to show you where their writing goal is recorded. Our individual writing goals are designed to assist our students become reflective learners, to review their work and self assess against their goal. It is further evidence of the active role that the students have in their learning.
